
# Seriously Delinquent Mortgages by State, 1979 Quarter 1 - 2012 Quarter 2




### Total Mortgages Serviced in Nevada, 1979 Q1 - 2012 Q2






### **Cross-District Foreclosure Comparison**













































Weekly foreclosure notices from January, 2009 to November, 2012, by notice type.

















#### Survey Among All Residents, 2012 (pg. 300-309)

Survey of 500 individuals currently undergoing, recently experiencing, or narrowly avoiding home foreclosure in Nevada since May of 2010. Interviews were conducted on the evenings of April 22–24, 2012 with respondents on both landline and mobile phones.

#### Survey Among Foreclosed Individuals, 2012 (pg. 309-316)

A Random Digit Dial (RDD) survey conducted among residents 18 years and older on both landlines and mobile phones on the evenings of March 29 – April 2. The results of this survey are roughly representative of adult Nevada residents.

#### Personal Experience Survey, 2011 (pg. 316-325)

500 live telephone interviews were conducted with individuals currently undergoing, recently experiencing, or narrowly avoiding home foreclosure. Interviews were conducted on the evenings of August 16-19, 2010, with respondents receiving at least one foreclosure notice (NOD, NTS, REO) in the preceding 12 months.

#### Survey In Affected Neighborhoods, 2011 (pg. 325-331)

500 live telephone interviews were conducted with individuals residing in neighborhoods with high rates of home foreclosures, but not having received any foreclosure notices on their own home. Interviews were conducted on the evenings of August 16-19, 2010.

<sup>\*</sup> On all surveys, weighting was applied to ensure representation with respect to age, gender, and geography. Margin of error is +/-4.9%.
